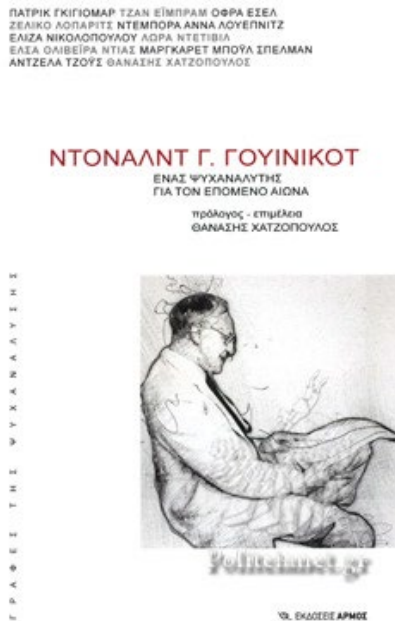


Hatzopoulos, T. (ed.). (2022). Ντόναλντ Γ. Γουίνικοτ – Ένας ψυχαναλυτής για τον επόμενο αιώνα (Donald W. Winnicott – A psychoanalyst for the next century). Athens: Armos Books.



This selection of articles is a precursory survey of some of Winnicott’s concepts –from the father and the paternal functions to the death drive, from the being to the becoming of the self, from the decline of the subject and its relations in the technology-enhanced labyrinths of modern life to childhood sexuality, from unconscious presence to the paradigm shift in psychoanalysis signaled by Winnicott. Considerations on the relationship between Winnicott’s thought and those of Lacan, Ferenczi and, mainly, Freud, are also embraced. Additionally, this collection proposes to sketch out the influences of Winnicott’s thought on contemporary psychoanalysis that go beyond the work of Winnicottian, and even non-Winnicottian groups – regardless of any ideological use made of his thought, or of the way his writings and thoughts have been received, used and multiplied – for Winnicott’s texts and, above all, his thought and his day-to-day labor and attitude as a psychoanalyst of children and adults remain fecund, prolific and eminently useful.

This collection was organized by Thanassis Hatzopoulos, with contributions from numerous psychoanalysts and scholars of Winnicott's thought from around the world. All the authors are affiliated to groups associated with the IWA, including Loparic and Elsa Oliveira Dias, from the IBPW, whose articles in this book are, respectively, “Achievements of Winnicott’s Revolution” (previously published in 2016 in *Pluralismo na Psicanálise* and republished the following year in *Winnicott and the Future of Psychoanalysis*) and “D. W. Winnicott: Resistance Against the Gradual Emptying and Objectification of Personal Relations” (published in *Winnicott and the Future of Psychoanalysis*).

Thanassis Hatzopoulos coordinates the Winnicott Athens Group and is an associate member of the IWA.
