II. Two-Year Management Plan for 2022-2023

II.1. The point of departure

- 1. Our main goal is to preserve, disseminate and develop Winnicott's legacy.
- 2. We understand that, in essence, Winnicott's intellectual legacy comprises:
 - A project for a revolutionary scientific paradigm shift in theory and in clinical practice;
 - b) The partial accomplishment of this paradigm shift; and
 - c) A number of remaining tasks related to understanding, developing and putting into practice his revolutionary project.

II.2. Teaching tasks

- Expand and build on the idea of a Winnicottian school in clinical theory and practices (the project of a "managing school" based on Winnicott's ideas, as envisioned by Balint in 1968).
- 2. Promote and endorse training courses worldwide in keeping with this idea.
- Foster and support extension courses on Winnicottian topics around the world.

II.3. Research tasks

We plan to foster, support and promote national and international research groups on the Winnicottian paradigm among IWA members and contributors. The Paradigm Group organized by Professor Loparic may serve as a template for an international research group (see Activities/Research on the IWA website).

II.4. Publication tasks

- Encourage the publication of individual books and collections through DWWeditorial.
- Promote the IWA Studies Collection, edited by Leticia Minhot. (The SBPW Report will be sent shortly, with more details.)
- 3. Publish in 2022 the proceedings of the Beijing Congress (Zhao Chenzhi and Susanna Guida, editors).
- 4. Promote the publication of the proceedings of the 2017 Paris Congress.
- Promote the publication of the proceedings of the 2019 Lisbon Congress.

- 6. Collaborate on the edition of the *International Winnicott Eprints*, IWIP. (The SBPW Report will be sent shortly, with more details.)
- 7. Maintain the IWA website and the IWA Blog. (See the IWA website).

II.5. Institutional tasks

- Promote the creation of Winnicottian institutions dedicated to resolving tasks that Winnicott left to be completed, or even unfinished.
- 2. Continue and renovate the activities of the IWA Presidency.
- 3. Organize the IWA's administrative office in the São Paulo headquarters.
- 4. Encourage new members to join.
- 5. Foster and support intellectual exchange between member-groups and individual members.
- 6. Preserve the pluralism of theories and ensure an atmosphere of tolerance.

- Actively manage and mediate eventual theoretical and other conflicts among members.
- 8. Organize the 5th IWA Congress in 2023.
- Keep finances in order by systematically collecting membership fees from member-groups.
